#### Summary of Trends:

Many of the groups have membership from outside the village and most of the groups are thriving. Nearly all would welcome the increase in membership that current developments might bring.

Many of the groups meet weekly and use the Memorial Hall. Predominantly the Vic Day Room. The need for another such sized room was identified.

Cost of hall hire is an issue for many groups. This is particularly true where additional costs are incurred for hire of space for changing.

Regular bookings are easy to make but those that meet sporadically eg SADS have some difficulty with bookings. Occasional booking must be made well in advance.

Many clubs identified a need for permanent projection facilities within the Memorial Hall. Others mentioned improved stage lighting and sound.

The development of a dedicated sports pavilion for eg Cricket was identified as a means of freeing up space in the memorial Hall.

Cricket Club and the Bowls Club identified a need for capital investment for changing and other facilities.

Other groups identified a need to develop new walks outside the developed area of the village.

Increased community sports facilities were identified eg community tennis courts and fitness trails..
